Abolish Abortion Wisconsin to Gather at Governor Walker's
Milwaukee Office to Demand Interposition for the Preborn and Total
Abolition of Abortion in Wisconsin

Milwaukee, WI—Today, Monday, March 13th, 2017, Abolish Abortion Wisconsin will gather outside Governor Walker's Milwaukee Office from 12 noon to 1:00 pm to make the public aware that the preborn can and should be protected in Wisconsin. The office is located at 819 N. 6th St. Rm 850 in Milwaukee.

At 1:00 pm, they will deliver a letter to Governor Walker demanding that he uphold Wisconsin statute and interpose against Roe v. Wade.

The letter states in part:

Governor Walker, the history of Western Civilization, the history of the founding of our nation, and the history of our own state repudiate the idea that you must obey an immoral, unjust, constitutionally-repugnant court opinion issued by the Supreme Court.

You cannot hide behind the common lie of governors - "The Supreme Court has ruled – all I can do is obey." Your duty is interposition.

The letter goes on to repudiate the idea that the Supreme Court is the final arbiter of what is constitutional or unconstitutional. A long list of quotes from America's Founders repudiating such a notion is employed, including Thomas Jefferson who stated, "**The Constitution has erected no such single tribunal.**"
